Abiding Peace Lutheran Church

For Lent this year Abiding Peace will offer two complementary series to aid in our 40-day preparation for Holy Week. On Sundays, our forums after worship will be exploring Wisdom traditions as a way to tap into the wisdom of our own community. On Thursday evenings, our midweek worship will be exploring different kinds of blessings.

Now, Wisdom and Blessings may not strike you as particularly Lenten themes. people associate Lent penitence and denial: the discipline of fasting and the practices of confession are common Lenten activities designed to make us confront our brokenness and grace. Wisdom and our need for Blessings may seem too positive for this season of the year. But Lent's purpose is not to make us feel bad, it is to cultivate in our lives and souls an openness to the grace of God that we find in the events of holy week. And anything that reminds us of our need for God can do this work of opening us.

The wisdom tradition of scripture has exactly this function. It calls us to ask the big questions and to take a deeper, more reflective look at our lives than we do when we are rushing through the busyness of everyday. Exploring wisdom themes together also calls us to listen to each other, which is an important way that God's grace is made real in our lives.

The practice of blessings is perhaps even more suited to opening our minds and hearts to the awareness of our need for grace.

In last summer's book club read. An Altar in the World, Barbara Brown Taylor makes the point that our act of offering blessing is mostauthentic when we intentionally separate the blessing from any claim that we have the right to judge worthiness with our words of blessings. This approach to blessing requires us to take ourselves down a few pegs and see that the most mundane things in our environment have something to teach us and that we can only speak blessing to them by focusing on them, rather than ourselves. It is subtle, but I think it is a reorientation that challenges the very essence of sin (defined by Luther as being incurvatus in se - curved in on oneself.). Near the end of the chapter on blessings, Taylor offers this quote:

"Pronouncing blessing puts you as close to God as you can get. To learn to look with compassion on everything that is; to see past the terrifying demons outside to the bawling hearts within; to make the first move toward the other, however many times it takes to get close; to open your arms to what is instead of waiting until it is what it should be; to surrender the justice of your own cause for mercy; to surrender the priority of your own safety for love -- this is to land in God's breast."

So, this year, our Lenten practices will call us into the humbling and connecting work of Wisdom and Blessings. I hope that we will all find in these practices a fitting and life-giving preparation for the expounding of God's grace in Holy Week.

Council had just a brief meeting this month after the election of our Council leaders for 2025. Two discussions of note:

- We elected Council officers. This year's officers are:

 - Treasurer: George Pawlo
- We discussed winter-weather policies when we have substitute musicians / preachers.
 - In the event of cancelled in-person worship, we will ask the substitute preacher to lead zoom worship, with the livestream assistant acting as host to the zoom meeting.
 - In the event of cancelled in-person worship, our service will not include music. We will, however, still provide a payment of \$150 to the musicians to compensate for practice time and them holding the time on their schedules.
 - We will resume snow-clearing of one side of the stairs from the upper lots, since people are using that lot during services.

ADULT EDUCATION PLANNING

The Feb. 23 forum on Adult Education generated some great reflection about what we want from our faith-building learning opportunities at Abiding Peace and how best to make them accessible to the congregation as a whole. In that spirit of inclusion, we agreed to also elicit feedback from the larger congregation about these ideas. - Generally, Sunday after worship is the best time for people to gather, since we are already here at the church and in-person learning is the most engaging.
- Planning to have forums/learning opportunities twice a month is preferred to give time for other activities while still being able to do series on a given topic
- If we gather mid-week in the evenings, it is helpful to have a dinner option (like Advent and Lent soup suppers)
- There's not a lot of energy for continuing the Summer Book Clubs we can explore other options for Summer learning opportunities.
- We could still offer zoom learning options in the Winter, when darkness and weather making driving more difficult.

PARTNERSHIP TEAM

As discussed at the Congregational Meeting, we are in need of some volunteers to help with moving our partnering efforts forward. We have a team for developing sample contract agreements, but we still need for folks for the other two teams. The descriptions are copied below. Please carefully consider helping:

Organizational Outreach team:

- Time commitment: 3-6 month effort with monthly meetings or tasks. Ad hod follow-up, as needed.
- Task: focused effort to identify, outreach to, and meet with organizational allies to help spread the word about our new partnering ministry and identify potential partners in need of space. Potential outreach targets include: Local Chambers of Commerce, the Mayor, Morris County Arts, Professional Counseling organizations (NASW, etc.)

Partnership Ministry Team:

- Time commitment: less intense, but on-going.
- Task: Strategy and logistics team to support Pastor Serena in managing on-going partnership relationships. Support tasks will include providing feedback and problem-solving for emergent partnership issues, providing back-up coverage as partner contact when Pastor Serena is away or unavailable (by prior arrangement), assist with managing logistical tasks such as maintenance needs, partner communications, etc.
