

#### THE SPIRITUAL PRACTICE OF FLORILEGIA

A medieval Christian practice called Florilegia (in Latin it means "gathering flowers") is the act of gathering favorite words and phrases from a text like gathering flowers into a bouquet. In the seventh century, a French monk named Defensor called his gathering of favorite words and phrases The Book of Sparklets. In this season we will collect sparklets! As you listen, you are invited to underline or circle words, phrases, or whole verses that "sparkle" to you. Each reading will be read twice, When the reading ends, you will have the opportunity to write your sparklets onto paper flowers to be hung on our tree.

#### THE PSALM

Luke 1: 68–79

The Psalm will be spoken responsively.

- Blessed be the Lord God of Israel,for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them.
- 69 He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his servant David,

- 70 as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,
- 71 that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.
- 72 Thus he has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors, and has remembered his holy covenant,
- 73 the oath that he swore to our ancestor Abraham, to grant us
- 74 that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might serve him without fear,
- 75 in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.


