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WORDS FOR REFLECTION

Mary's song of praise is one of the most recognizable passages of scripture, and also one of the most frequently banned. The Magnificat is so much more than one woman's awe-filled response to God's intervention in her life. It is a century-spanning reflection on God's pattern of saving work, which topples human efforts to control history and continually calls us to attend to those whom we think we can ignore or exclude. In her "magnification" of God's work, we are called to reexamine our own world.





P God in our midst,


C we confess that we have sinned. We plead: come to us. Birth in our hearts the new life of your mercy.










Modern Magnificat Scene 3: Meeting of a church education planning team





P Dear Jesus, teach us to pray:






