WE NEED ALL FOUR SEASONS by Pastor Serena

Even before record heat waves, I was never a huge fan of New Jersey summers. My childhood in California spoiled me with the joy of dry heat, and I just cannot stand the humid stickiness every time I walk outside or the need to always have a rain-out alternative when planning outdoor activities. If it were under my control, I would be delighted to stretch out our state's temperate, flower-filled weeks of spring to last at least until July and advance the beginning of fall's cooling breezes and changing leaves to start sometime mid-August. A few weeks of summer steam would be plenty for me.

Much as I dislike humidity and heat waves, however, I would not eliminate summer entirely. Because we need all four seasons.

It's a sentiment I encountered recently in one of Maddox's favorite book series. The books chronicle the adventures of four clans of wild cats in a fictional forest, whose lives in many ways revolve around the cycles of the seasons. At one point, the question is raised about whether nature got it wrong, as it would be better to have no season of winter when the elements are harsh and food is scarce. The response from one of the wise leader cats is an emphatic "No." Despite the hardships, winter is necessary. It gives time for the forest to rest and restore before the abundance of new life in the spring.

This scene in the story has stuck with me because it illustrates some deep truths that have relevance beyond the world of fiction.

One truth is the reminder that in determining what has value we need to consider more than just our individual comfort and experiences. Sometimes the things that we find difficult are necessary in a larger scheme, and we will find them easier to bear if we embrace that perspective. The other truth is the recognition that there is purpose in every season (whether actual or metaphorical) because of its role in the balance of the whole.

When we apply this truth to spirituality, it reminds us that the life of faith is not supposed to be experienced as a perpetual spring (or summer, autumn, or winter...whichever appeals most to you). We need variation in our spiritual path as well: times of obvious growth and abundant joy, but also times that move toward rest and apparent fallowness; times with extra light and activity, and times of quiet and stillness in which to ask our deepest questions. Life is cyclical by design. We need the variation, and embracing this need will help us to find life in whatever season we are currently experiencing. If we spend the "summers" feeling overwhelmed, exhausted, and longing for everything to slow down, we will not appreciate the gifts of light and opportunity. If we bemoan the cold and seeming lifelessness of "winters" in our faith, we will lose out on the chance for rest and reflection. There is a gift in each season if we will find it.

So, through the heat and stickiness of this summer, and through the flurry of tasks associated with our church's partnering efforts, I am trying to remind myself that every season has value. There are opportunities to learn and to find life in this moment. Thanks be to God.




