HOPE AS A GOAL by Pastor Serena

Sometimes the process of developing the theme for our Advent worship involves a lot of thought, reflection on the readings, listening to the needs of our community, and seeking God's inspiration. Other times, I just find a resource and think "that will work!" I confess that this year, I went with door number 2. The ELCA liturgy planning resource included a midweek service plan centered around "Restoring our Hope" and I liked it so... great. Hope. Theme selected.

Sometimes that's how God's Spirit works: through convenience rather than prayerful dedication. I'm very grateful. Because it has become increasingly clear to me over the last month of planning that hope is precisely what our community needs at the moment. Hope for health and wholeness. Hope for comfort in grief. Hope for a future in the midst of anxiety.

I am also increasingly aware that hope is something that has to be built. It does not just happen. We cannot simply summon hope through positive thinking. Recently, researcher/ author Brene Brown shared a reflection on hope that includes this insight: "The research shows that hope is a powerful antidote to despair. What's interesting, however, is that hope is not an emotion (C. R. Snyder). Hope is a cognitive-behavioral process. It's about having a goal, a pathway to achieve that goal, and a sense of urgency, or "I can do this."

"Cognitive-behavioral process" is a fancy therapy term for something that we create through a combination of conscious thoughts and intentional actions. We have to put effort into the patterns of our thoughts and our behaviors in order to cultivate hope. And, according to Brown, we specifically need to focus on a goal and a way to achieve that goal.

It makes sense, but I think it can be a little hard to know how to apply this wisdom in the context of faith, because faith calls us to put our trust in God, rather than in our own efforts. In the Lutheran tradition, especially, we focus so much on grace and on how God is the one who always initiates and assures our salvation, so that we know we never earn it. This is a vitally important teaching when it comes to our standing before God, but that doesn't mean that we are called to be passive in everything. Far from it. We are given grace so that we might have life. And life is active, just as hope is active.

So, for this Advent season, our community will be focusing on practices hope. Our goal, the hope we look to (especially in Advent) is to prepare for the coming of God's kingdom, God's way of being in the world. And there are absolutely active practices that we can embrace to achieve that goal. I hope you will join in our efforts to build hope.
